- door repairs and replacement.

Examples of janitorial duties include:

- vacuuming of carpets and upholstery
- dusting and cleaning of furniture, mill work, windows, walls, carpets, and upholstery
- cleaning, sanitizing, and stocking of washrooms.

Examples of furniture maintenance include:

- shelf installations
- furniture moves and assembly
- equipment assembly.

Required Qualifications:

- excellent communication skills
- ability to work independently and, as part of a team
- training and/or experience in painting, carpentry, and plumbing
- minimum of two years' experience in custodial and/or maintenance work preferably in a building with an automated security system
- ability to do heavy lifting
- secondary school graduation
- flexibility and willingness to accept assignments on short notice.
