Role of the Local Social Justice Contact

In your role as Local Social Justice Contact (LSJC), you:

1. advocate to be an active member of the local executive and for the creation of a local Social Justice Committee.
2. encourage all schools in the district to elect a school-based Social Justice contact.
3. attend training at Summer Conference before the beginning of each school year.
4. attend zone meetings and participate in the discrete session for Social Justice contacts.
5. distribute Social Justice materials provided to you and check for regular updates.
6. monitor and distribute communiques from the BCTF related to Social Justice.
7. promote and encourage local executives to book Social Justice workshops.
8. consider applying to become a BCTF Social Justice workshop facilitator.
9. consider standing for election as a delegate to attend the annual BCTF Annual General Meeting.
10. advocate for local Social Justice policies and a local equity audit.
11. advocate for the adoption of specific district policies on racism.
12. support members experiencing racism or sexual harassment in accessing local and provincial supports.
13. support members in applying for the many BCTF Social Justice grants.
